

Rudolph R. Stark, 88, of Mercerville, NJ, passed away on Saturday, June 15, 2019, at Capital Health Medical Center at Hopewell. He was the president/ owner of Star C Trucking Inc. in Trenton, NJ, for 37 years. A graduate of Bordentown Military Institute and a Free and Accepted Mason of the Masonic Grand Lodge of New Jersey for more than 50 years, he began his entrepreneurial life as an owner operator hauling freight from Long Island to the West Coast. He hauled 80-90,000 pounds of steel cables from the Roebling factory in Trenton to build the Verrazano Bridge and transported materials to build the New Jersey Turnpike

and parts for the Globe at the New York World's Fair. In the 1980s, he was a top General Motors salesperson for the Mid-Atlantic region before founding Star C Trucking Inc. A highly respected businessman, he was loved and admired by friends and employees alike. He was a member of the Crescent Shriners, a Master Mason of Mount Moriah Lodge No. 28 (F & AM), a Mason of Trenton Forest No. 4, an Excelsior Consistory Shriner, and a member of the BMI Alumni Association and the United Presbyterian Church of Yardville. A former race car owner, he enjoyed watching NASCAR racing, keeping up with the news, and eating a good steak. He always knew the weather forecast when you asked. He had a great sense of humor and was quick to make you laugh. He was generous toward others. He adored his wife and was a beloved husband. Rudolph is survived by his loving and devoted wife, Dee J. Stark, and a loving family. He will be well-remembered with fondness, and greatly missed.
